I wanted to take the time this week to celebrate with our whole school community the excellent results achieved by our Year 6 pupils who left us in July. It is statutory that we share these results and, as such, they will be on our school website as well as on the back of this newsletter. As you can see, Wittersham CEP School is above the national average in every area with our combined percentage of pupils who achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics being more than 36% above national.

We are, of course, thrilled for our pupils to achieve such high academic standards but equally as important to us all is the development of every child as happy, healthy, confident learners who

have opportunities to flourish across the curriculum as well as in extra-curricular pursuits. This journey begins with our youngest children in Foundation Stage as we aspire to instil in them a life-long love of learning.
