Our Pupil Premium Funding in 2014/2015 = £22,100

The funding is being used to provide targeted support in numeracy and literacy and the staff to provide small group work focusing on reducing the attainment gap between the highest and lowest attainers. There are funded educational visits. Support from an experienced class teacher who is also the SENCO.

Impact of Pupil Premium expenditure 2014-2015

- All children receiving the grant attained higher than the children not receiving the grant for level 2b plus at the end of Year 2 in reading, writing and mathematics.
- All children receiving the grant attained higher than the children not receiving the grant for level 3 at the end of Year 2 in reading, writing and mathematics.
- In year 3 100% of children receiving the grant achieved expected levels in reading and mathematics at the end of the year which was higher than the children not receiving the grant.
- In year 4 100% of children receiving the grant achieved expected levels at the end of the year in reading and mathematics which was higher than the children not receiving the grant. 83% achieved expected levels in writing which was higher than the children not receiving the grant.
- In year 5 100% of children receiving the grant achieved expected levels in reading and mathematics at the end of the year which was higher than the children not receiving the grant.
- Children receiving the grant attained higher than children not receiving the grant in more than expected progress in Reading at the end of Year 6.
- 100% of children receiving the grant made expected progress in Writing at the end of Year 6. This is above national.
