School uniform reminder

As the weather is beginning to change and at the start of a new school year it seemed like a good opportunity to remind parents of our school uniform expectations. We are really proud of our school uniform and expect all children to wear it. However, I have noticed increasing numbers of children who are not wearing correct school uniform.

- Footwear with uniform should be black, practical school shoes not trainers.
- Tight fitting shorts or leggings are not permitted.
- PE kit is a plain yellow t-shirt with black plain shorts or jogging bottoms. Children
 may wish to wear their school jumper or a plain hoody in appropriate weathers NO football strips allowed.
- If ears are pierced, only one pair of studs may be worn for safety reasons. These should not be worn on PE days, but if they cannot be removed, they must be covered up with tape which each child should keep in their PE bag.
- Socks (white or black) and tights should be plain (black or grey).
- No jewellery (except watches), nail varnish or make up.
