We hope you can join us.






Parent Consultations

Parent Governor Election



Could we remind parents who wish to vote that returned slips need to be sent in as detailed below:

- Ballot papers should be returned in a sealed, inner, unmarked envelope
- The sealed, unmarked envelope should then be placed in a second, outer envelope
 - The second, outer envelope should clearly be marked with:
 - 'Parent Governor Election'
 - the name and address of the voter
 - the name(s) of the voter's child(ren)
 - the voter's signature across the seal

Failure to submit your ballot (voting) paper in this way, may result in your vote not being counted.

A reminder that the deadline for votes is **Tuesday 26th March.** Any votes received after this date cannot be counted.

Thank you to all parents who took time to contribute to our 3rd option survey. It was great to have your feedback and input into our menu too. As a result of this, from Term 5 our 3rd option on the menu will consist of filled baguettes (Monday and Wednesday) and a pasta dish (Tuesday, Thursday and Friday). Baguettes will be served with a small selection of salad, whilst pasta dishes will be served with the vegetable option from the menu such as peas, sweetcorn or broccoli. Jacket potatoes will return alongside our new pasta option within our 'Winter Menu' in November.

Alongside these changes, we will continue to offer children milk, our popular salad bar, fresh fruit and yoghurts daily.

Mrs Catt would love to create a new resource for our Windmill's outside space similar to this one below.




If you have any spare, bolts, locks, plugs/plug sockets, handles, switches etc and you could donate them to Windmills, we would be very grateful.
